And this exhibition is a temporary exhibition.

Temporary exhibition means:

Museion shows this exhibition only for a few months.

And Museion will present a new temporary exhibition after this one.

The exhibition “Time Aspects” is from **March 17 to June 4.**

There will be an opening ceremony at Museion on March 17.

That means:

The exhibition is open after this opening ceremony.

And everyone can visit the exhibition.

The exhibition will be at **Museion Passage.**

Museion Passage is right behind the entrance hall
on the ground floor of Museion.

Museion Passage is accessible.

And entry to Museion Passage is free.

What is the exhibition about?

The exhibition is about the life and work of Albert Mayr.

Albert Mayr is a composer and sound artist.

Composers write music.

For example: songs and musical pieces.

Albert Mayr lives and works in Florence.

Florence is a city in Italy.

But Albert Mayr was born in Bolzano.

Albert Mayr turns 80 years old this year.

And Museion wants to celebrate with him.

That is why Museion is making this exhibition.

Albert Mayr believes:

Sounds and noises can tell us many things.

People just have to listen carefully.

For example:

- How do people live?
- Do people live well or poorly?
- And what problems do people have?

Albert Mayr always listens and then thinks about the sounds.

For example:

- Can a sound be heard over and over again?
- Is a sound always heard in a certain sequence?
- Or are other sounds added to this sound?

Sometimes he uses certain sounds for his projects.

Albert Mayr also thinks about time and music.

For example:

- How do music and time relate to each other?
- How do people think about music and time?

Albert Mayr believes:

People should rethink their relationship with time.

That means:

How do I deal with my time?

What does time mean to me?

That is why Albert Mayr also wrote articles about time and music.

What can you see in this exhibition?

In the exhibition you can see works of art by Albert Mayr.

And you can also see works of art by other artists in the exhibition.

Albert Mayr has done many projects in his life.

For example:

The movie "Von Zeiten und Leuten: am Beispiel Sarntal."

The visitors to the exhibition can watch this movie.

And the visitors to the exhibition should carefully listen while watching.

That is because this movie has many sounds.

The visitors can learn different things by hearing these sounds:

- How did people in this valley live?

For example:

Sounds of men plowing the cornfields.

- And what was important to these people?

A movie by Claudio Chianura is also shown in the exhibition.

The movie is called: "Albert Mayr - Dall'Alto Adige all'universo dei suoni."

Albert Mayr talks about his music in this movie.

But Albert Mayr also talks about his works of art and his thoughts.

Can you also visit events?

There will be events at Museion Passage in addition to the exhibition.

The event "**Museion plays Albert Mayr**" is on March 30.

This event starts at 7 pm.

And admission is free.

There will be different artists in Museion for this event.

These artists have closely observed the work of Albert Mayr.

And these artists may think like Albert Mayr about music and time.

The artists explain something about the music at the beginning.

And then the artists play pieces of music by Albert Mayr for the visitors.

The event "**In Context**" is on April 29.

Simone Faraci from "Tempo reale" will hold this event.

"Tempo reale" is an Italian institute.

This institute studies music
and how people are learning music.

Simone Faraci is a musician and composer.

Simone Faraci wants to show at this event:

That is what the "soundwalk" of Albert Mayr could have been like.

A "soundwalk" is a walk
where people listen carefully to sounds.

Simone Faraci will accompany participants of the event
into the city of Bolzano.

And Simone Faraci will help these participants to explore the sounds of Bolzano.
