Museion.

Museion is the museum for "contemporary and modern art" in Bolzano.

Museion was founded in 1985.

And Museion has been a foundation since 2006.

Foundation means:

Several people can set up a foundation together.

Then this foundation can:

- Help other people.
- Support artists.
- Or buy works of art.

The Autonomous Province of Bolzano and "Museion Association" set up this foundation in 2006.

Museion shows:

- **Regional art.**

Regional art means:

Works of art by artists from the surrounding area.

For example:

South Tyrol.

- **National art.**

National art means:

Works of art by artists from one specific country.

For example:

Italy.

- International art.

International art means:

Works of art by artists from different countries around the world.

- And contemporary and modern art.

These works of art are from the last 120 years.

Architects from the architectural office "KSV" in Berlin have planned a unique building for Museion. Museion has been in this building since 2008.

Museion has had a new director since 2020.

The name of the director is Bart van der Heide.

Museion.

There are always works of art to look at.

And there are always new exhibitions.

But Museion also shows works of art in other places:

- At the Museion Passage.
- And at Cubo Garutti.

Museion Passage.

You can see works of art at Museion Passage.

And the entry to Museion Passage is free.

Museion Passage is on the first floor of Museion.

Museion Passage takes you from the old town of Bolzano into the newer parts of the city.

Cubo Garutti.

“Cubo Garutti” is a space for exhibitions that belongs to Museion.

This space is in the Don Bosco district of Bolzano.

“Cubo Garutti” was built in 2003 by Alberto Garutti.

“Cubo Garutti” does **not** only show art from Museion.

The residents of the Don Bosco district

also do different projects with art in “Cubo Garutti.”

“Cubo Garutti” is located at Via Sassari 17b in Bolzano.

The collection of art.

Museion has an extensive collection of art.

That is because Museion has bought many works of art over time.

Museion often shows these works of art

together with newly purchased works of art.

And Museion makes exhibitions on specific topics.

Opening hours.

Opening hours mean:

People can visit Museion at these times.

Museion is open:

- On Tuesday and Wednesday from 10 am to 6 pm.
- On Thursday from 10 am to 10 pm.
- And from Friday to Sunday from 10 am to 6 pm again.

So you can access the exhibitions until 5:30 pm in general.

But you can access the exhibition until 9:30 pm on Thursday.

Museion also has a shop where you can buy various things.

For example:

- Books.
- Postcards.
- Or gifts.

The Museion shop closes half an hour before Museion.

Admission.

Admission is another word for:

Entry.

How much does it cost to visit Museion?

There are different tickets for Museion.

And the tickets cost different amounts of money:

- 10 euros for most people.
- 5 euros for:
 - People with age over 65.
 - Students.
Please bring your student card.
 - People with disabilities.
Please bring your disability card.
 - And Members of Fai, Italia Nostra, MART, Ferdinandeum.

Museion also offers special prices.

Special prices are tickets for special times at Museion.

Special times mean:

Exhibitions are built during these times.

Then the tickets often cost:

- 7 euros for one or more floors under construction.
- 3 euros and 50 cents for:
 - People with age over 65.
 - Students.
 - People with disabilities.
 - Members of Fai, Italia Nostra, MART, Ferdinandeum.

Free admission.

That is:

You do **not** have to pay to visit the Museion.

Free admission is available:

- For all people on Thursday from 6 to 10 pm.
- For children and teenagers under 18 years.
- For companions of people with disabilities.
- For students at the University of Bolzano.

Please bring your student card.

- For Members of ICOM, AMACI, Amici del Museion Presse, SKB, Museumobilcards, unibz, and Forum members.

Guided tours.

You can also join a guided tour of the museum.

Guided tour means:

The staff members take the visitors on a tour of the exhibition.

And the staff members explain:

- Which works of art do you see?
- What do the works of art mean?
- And how did this exhibition come about?

Guided tour on Thursday evening.

Every Thursday there is a guided tour of Museion at 7 pm.

This tour is available in German and Italian.

And staff members of the museum will show you the works of art.

This tour is free.

Private tours and workshops.

You can apply for a private tour at the office of Museion.

A private tour for you and your group costs 60 euros.

This tour lasts one hour.

And the maximum number of people who can join this tour is 25.

Museion does workshops too.

You must also apply for a workshop.

A workshop for you and your group costs 90 euros.

The workshop lasts one and a half hours.

The minimum number of participants for the workshop is 6.

And the maximum number of participants for the workshop is 15.

Are you a student at the University of Bolzano?

Then a guided tour or workshop costs 2 euros per person.

Please apply early for tours and workshops.

Then you may still choose the date yourself.

Directions.

How can you find Museion?

- By train.

The train station in Bolzano is **not** far from Museion as the train station is close to the city center.

It takes only 15 minutes on foot to the museum.

- By bus.

Almost all the buses stop near Museion.

Are you arriving from Bolzano train station by bus?

Please exit the bus at "Dominikaner Platz."

Then walk a very short distance to Museion.

Some buses also stop at "Sparkassenstraße."

You can reach Museion from there within a short walk.

Do you arrive from the Gries district?

Then exit at "Rosmini-Straße" or "Spital-Gasse".

- By car.

Do you reach Bolzano by car?

Then drive in the direction of the city center of Bolzano.

It is best to park your car in a public parking garage.

And then walk the last bit.

There are just a few parking spaces near Museion.

Parking.

Museion offers **no** parking for cars and coaches.

Museion has 2 accessible parking lots in front of the building.

All the parking lots in Bolzano charge a fee.

Airplane.

The airport of Bolzano is called: Airport Bolzano Dolomiti.

The airport is in the south of Bolzano.

Are you traveling to Bolzano by plane?

Then you can take the bus lines 10B and 10A from the airport to the city.

Are you traveling to another airport?

Then you still must get to Bolzano:

- From Innsbruck airport: 120 kilometers.
- From Verona airport: 150 kilometers.
- From Bergamo airport: 180 kilometers.
- From Treviso airport: 150 kilometers.
